CONFERENCE CONCEPTS AND OBJECTIVES

The GCC-Türkiye Economic Forum seeks to enhance the bilateral relationship in all its dimensions, with an emphasis on economic, development, and private-sector cooperation. As such, the forum's key objectives include:

- Exploring the different aspects that make up the strategic economic relationship between the GCC and Türkiye
- Discussing the various developments of legal processes in investing in the GCC and Türkiye
- Highlighting the various economic and business opportunities that exist in light of recent regional and international developments
- Providing a platform for networking by engaging key private and public actors from the GCC and Türkiye policy and corporate community
- Encouraging the exchange of experiences and expertise in the business sectors between the GCC and Türkiye
- Exploring ways to incorporate and stimulate small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs)
- Strengthening economic and developmental relations to serve as a foundation for a more cooperative climate that is conducive to better political ties













GCC-TÜRKIYE OVERVIEW





Türkiye hosts a powerful regional economy boasting as the 19th largest economy in the world, with a GDP of roughly \$906 billion and is a regional leader in a variety of sectors with a workforce of approximately 33 million. The GCC states has a total GDP in excess of \$3.464 trillion. With its geographical location, Türkiye serves as a hub between Europe and the Gulf region. The GCC countries and Türkiye have complementary economic systems, which provide a solid foundation for expanding investment and commercial ties. Ankara's foreign policy has recently become more concerned with finding new export markets and seeking foreign investment into the Turkish economy. The GCC's extensive foreign reserves offer a solid ground for a synergistic investment partnership across multiple sectors to establish and transfer industrial knowledge and expertise.

GCC states have been bolstering their foreign investments. According to the UAE's Ministry of Economy, cumulative foreign investments totaled \$215 billion as of the end of 2021. Kuwait's direct investments abroad were around \$32.741 billion. These numbers highlight the increased interest of GCC businesses in participating in overseas markets, as well as the favorable benefits that foreign direct investment has on these entities. These strategic exchanges in emerging markets have the potential to benefit both recipient countries and domestic investors.

Since 2022, \$15.8 billion in foreign direct investment (FDI) has been put into Türkiye from the GCC states. Among the GCC states, Qatar invested the most in Türkiye at 62%. The UAE takes second place with 21% and Saudi Arabia takes third place with 16% of the GCC states' total foreign direct investments (FDI). It is likely that this amount will increase in the coming years through investments in energy, defense, banking, retail, and transportation.

Given the commitment by the GCC to cooperate with Türkiye in the coming years along with the significant capacity to increase bilateral trade, the 2023 GCC-Türkiye Economic Forum will be an ideal opportunity to explore areas of cooperation. Considering the increasingly volatile geopolitical landscape and deteriorating great power relations, it is crucial to solidify regional ties through economic development. The GCC and Türkiye represent vital regional powers in the Middle East in various sectors.





CONFERENCE THEMES

1. TRADE AND INVESTMENT

Trade between Türkiye and the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) members has experienced a robust resurgence in recent years. In 2020, Türkiye's trade with the GCC reached \$22 billion. This trade primarily revolves around energy, agricultural products, and manufactured goods. The manufacturing sector plays a pivotal role in facilitating the flow of goods between these two regions. Turkish manufacturers are renowned for their competitiveness and high-quality products, and they have found a receptive market among GCC states, while Turkish businesses benefit from GCC-produced petrochemical and construction materials.



The GCC's concerted efforts to attract foreign direct investment (FDI) has led to the emergence of opportunities in sectors such as real estate, telecommunications, data infrastructure, fintech, and clean energy. These opportunities, coupled with the advantages of investing in this region—such as a robust rule of law, strong creditworthiness, and many currencies pegged to the US dollar—provide investors with a secure means of safeguarding their financial interests while simultaneously mitigating investment risks. Similarly, Türkiye stands as an attractive destination for international investors. FDI serves as a primary driver in Türkiye's transition towards higher value-added services. Following a series of initiatives involving both public and private stakeholders, Türkiye's participation in global value chains has become increasingly prominent.

The contributions of GCC members as key sources of energy, coupled with Türkiye's role as a major food supplier, have fostered a mutually beneficial trade relationship. This synergy continues to drive economic cooperation and growth between Türkiye and the GCC.





2. INDUSTRY AND LOGISTICS

Diversified industries around the world are working to meet the demands of a growing global economy, urbanization, an increasingly digital consumer, and a more mobile population. Clients in the private and governmental sectors are searching for innovative strategies and technology to help them better serve their consumers by improving safety, travel quality, capacity, and security while at the same time, weighing revenue growth, cost reduction, and operational efficiency against conflicting demands for limited resources. Türkiye is a prominent manufacturing hub of the Middle East region and home to many of those very industries. The GCC countries are endowed with oil reserves making their



economy heavily reliant on the revenue generated from the oil and gas industry, and also highly adept in subsidized raw materials. Presently, GCC nations are embarking on economic diversification as a means to shield against the adverse impacts of downturns in the oil and gas industry and also for better economic stability. TürkiyeandtheGCCare pursuing ways to strengthen their global competitiveness and ensure economic development and critical technology advancement. They are doing so by investing heavily in tools that promote long-term economic growth. Türkiye's manufacturing know-how along with GCC nations' well-established chemical and petrochemical industries present ample opportunity for the two regions to join forces to fundamentally rethink business models and better support national goals for their economies in many areas including business establishment knowledge, construction services, manufacturing industries, as well as low risk digital investments like big data and analytics, on-demand mobility, and blockchain. The GCC-Türkiye Economic Forum will present myriad opportunities accompanied by experts, specialists, and government officials with vital insight for a better understanding of the sector.





3. INFRASTRUCTURE

An essential component for equitable and sustainable growth is high-quality infrastructure. Industrial development is essential for Middle Eastern economic diversification and although many Middle Eastern economies have improved their urban physical infrastructure, the performance of the transportation infrastructure, namely their highways, and airports, requires continuous attention and maintenance. The GCC states have launched multiple large-scale projects in an effort to meet current and future demand, offering numerous investment opportunities. It was recently estimated that the region



had more than US\$3 trillion worth of projects in the works, mostly in the fields of construction, power, transportation, and the oil and gas industry.

Evidence suggests that infrastructure remains an appealing long-term investment opportunity for institutional investors, and to stay in the race, the GCC and Türkiye should push the frontiers of investable assets. As local populations increase and urbanization becomes more of a pressing matter, both the GCC and Türkiye will have to enhance their respective infrastructures to accommodate the new demands. The GCC-Türkiye Economic Forum will serve as a platform to exchange best practices and explore potential projects for public-private partnership contracts.







4. AGRICULTURE AND FOOD

The global food crisis has had a significant impact on the Middle East. Of the approximately 296 million people in the Middle East, 28% are dependent on agriculture, yet it accounts for only 13% of the Middle East's GDP. As the war in Ukraine continues, drastic food prices and cost of living increases have exacerbated the issue, thrusting food security into the forefront of national agenda strategy discussions. Conversely, Türkiye's agricultural sector is among the top ten in the world, with agricultural product exports increasing 17.3% year on year in the first ten months of 2022 to over \$27.53 billion, according to the Turkish Exporters Assembly. Panel



discussions at the GCC-Türkiye Economic Forum will provide an opportunity to scan the shortcomings and gaps in the respective agricultural sectors, in order to provide a better understanding of how a mutually beneficial partnership can be developed. Of additional importance will be exploring how to diversify and better safeguard GCC food sources, whether by instituting and transferring Turkish agricultural expertise or by developing a bilateral partnership between the GCC and Türkiye.





5.SPORTS

Sports have a significant impact on the economies of the GCC countries and Türkiye. Respective countries invest heavily in developing world-class sporting infrastructure as well as hosting and promoting sporting events, which generate revenue and create jobs for local communities, as seen in past events such as the Qatar FIFA World Cup 2022 and the Saudi Arabian Grand Prix. Upcoming events like the Bahrain Grand Prix, Qatar Open Tennis Championship, and Abu Dhabi Grand Prix attract international visitors, generating revenue for the hospitality, retail, and transportation industries. The development of sports facilities in the GCC has led to an increase in sportsrelated businesses, contributing positively to the GCC's economic diversification. Major sporting events attract international media attention, boosting the region's profile and attracting investment. Turkey has recognized the economic potential of sports and has made substantial investments in sports infrastructure, hosting major events like the FIBA Basketball World Cup, European Athletics Championships, and the Grand Prix Formula One World Championship between 2005 and 2011. The Turkish government's focus on sports tourism has also boosted the economy, with the country's natural landscapes and historical sites providing a unique backdrop for sporting events. As these nations continue to invest in sports, the positive effects on their economies are expected to persist and grow in the future.
